Doctor, who has not improved. Tell Robert his
four pounds are our best Christmas gift as we
well know they are yours. All the season's deep

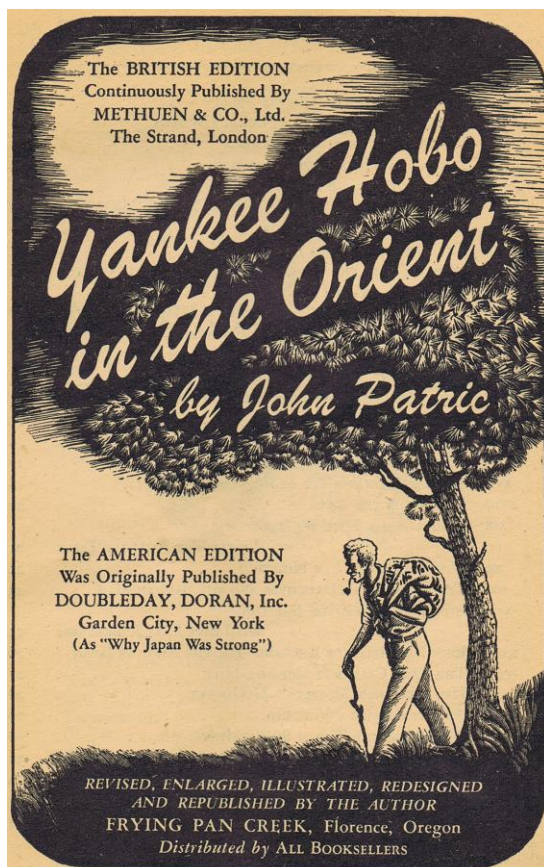
of Seattle, who has made 96 trips to the Orient, and who therefore has had a chance to see a great deal more of it in many of its important aspects, than have I.

Prosperity Sphere!"



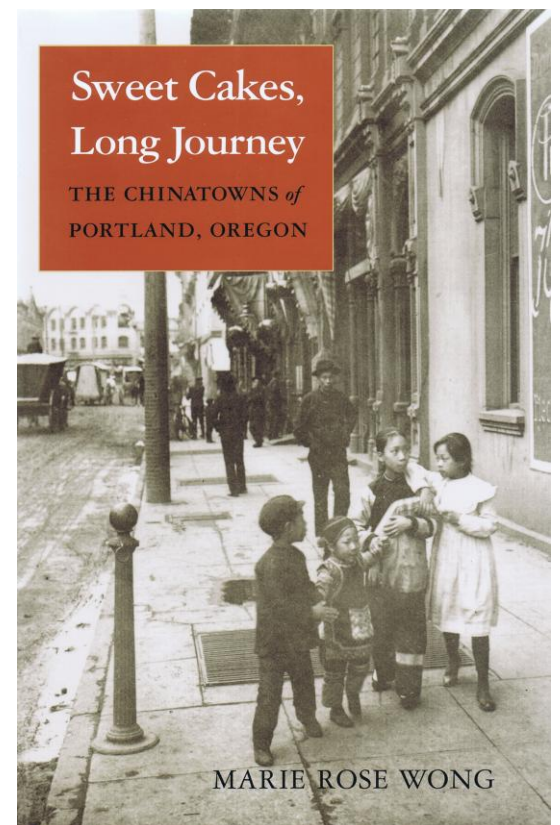

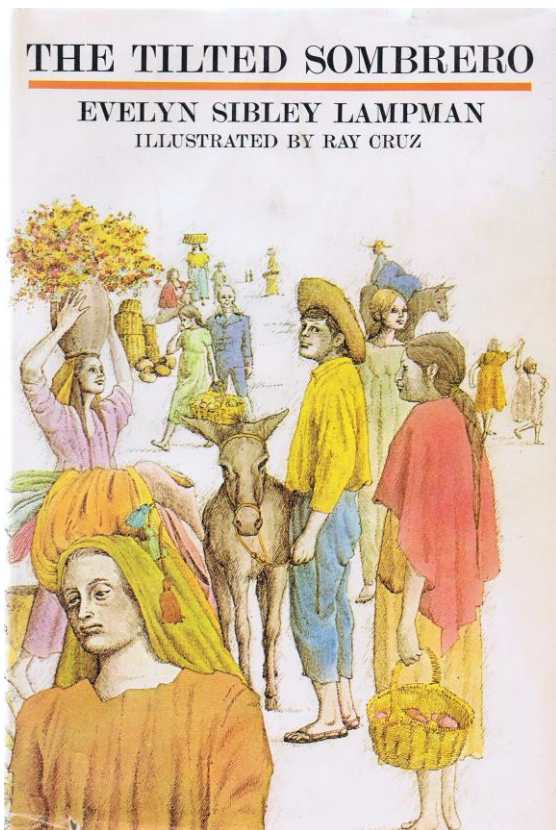

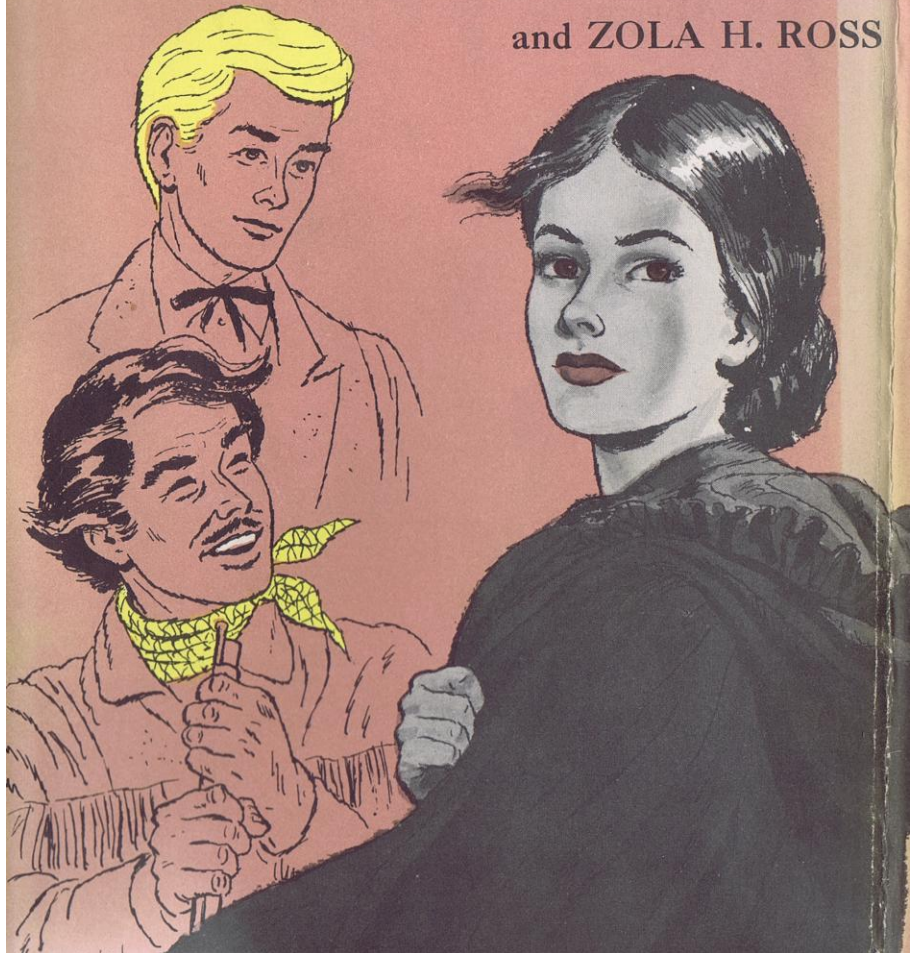

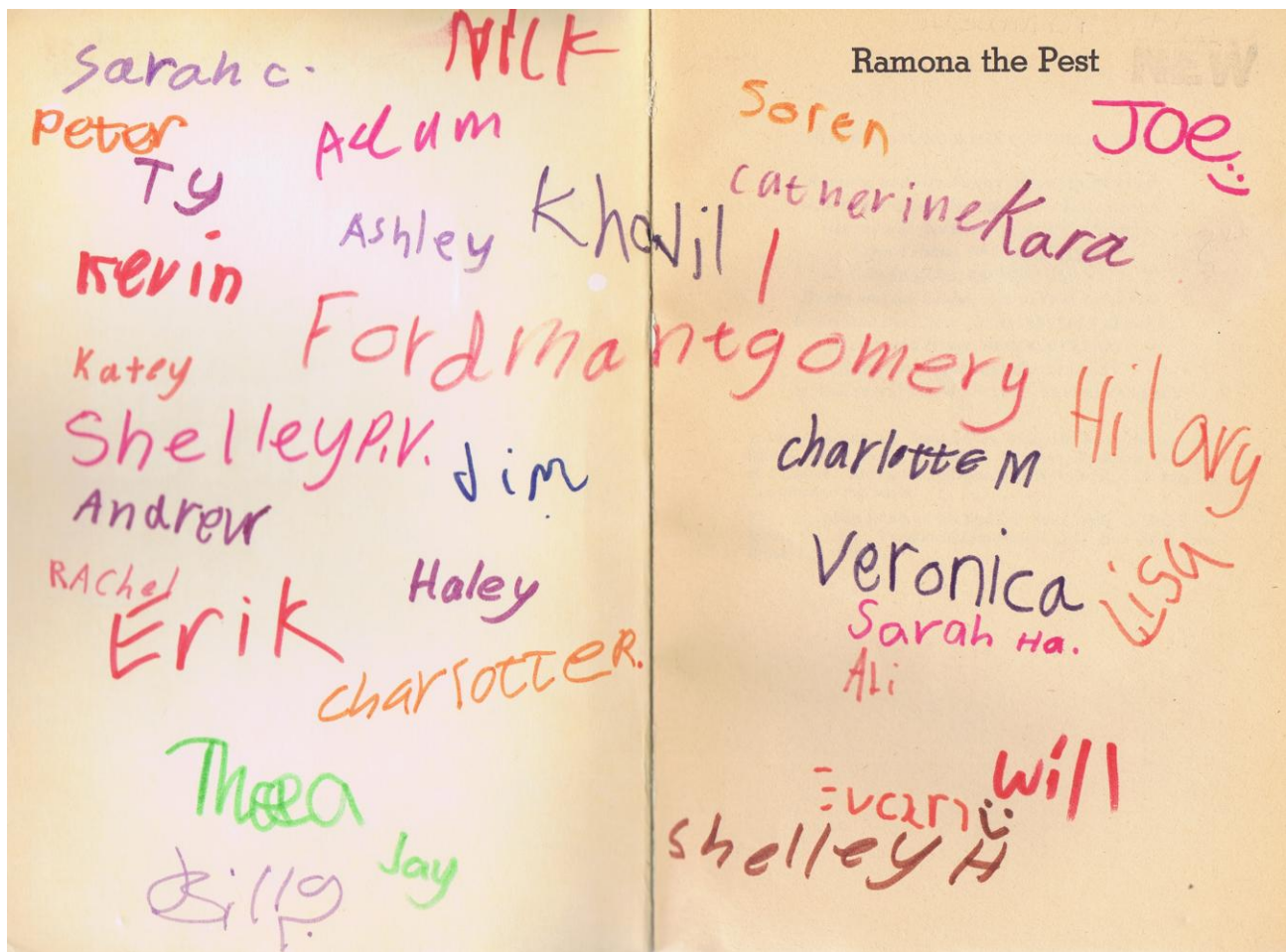

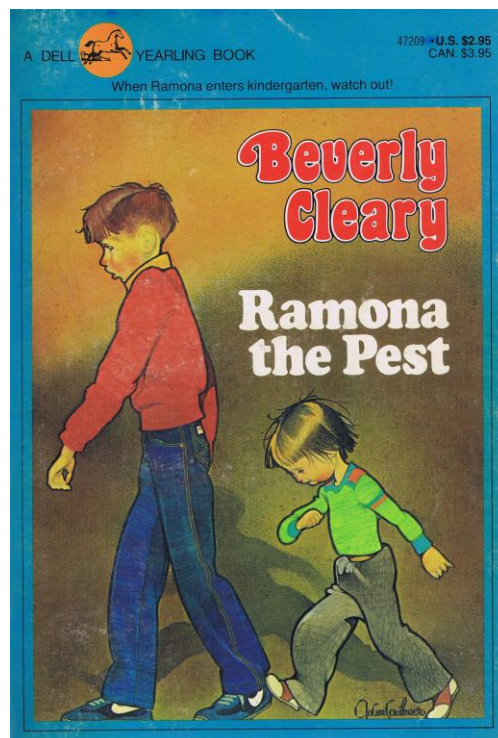
